EMPLOYMENT RESOURCE CENTER

Located at MFSC JBPHH Moanalua Center, this self-service center is offered to service members and their families. It offers employment resources, access to our job board, and computers with internet and printing. ***

CLASSES AND EVENTS ***

(Virtual and In-person options specified on schedule. Verify location before registering.)

Acing the Interview: Learn what is needed to have a successful interview! Position yourself as the best candidate, learn different interview techniques, practice interview questions and learn to avoid common pitfalls. Practice interviews are offered.

Career Exploration: Discover what may be the perfect career for you through personality assessments and career study. Focus on your strengths, avoid undesirable career aspects.

Civilian Resume Writing: Explore different types of private sector resumes and the basics of writing a resume and cover letter.



Federal Employment 101: Obtain details on the federal employment process, completing applications, navigating the website, as well as hiring preferences for different populations.

Federal Employment 102: Assistance in building the most effective federal resume in the most efficient manner. Best practices, samples, and guidance on personal drafts are offered.

LinkedIn: Employers seek information about candidates in different ways, social media included. LinkedIn is a centralized space for professional networking. This class leads attendees through LinkedIn and provides guidance on how to best utilize the site.

Salary Negotiations: Discussion of the basics of the imposing process of negotiating your salary, benefits, or any other part of your employment.

*** CURRENT HIGHLIGHTS

Throughout the pandemic, your local FERP team has ensured that services are still available via both virtual and in-person means including virtual or in-person appointments and classes. The computer resource center is available by visiting the MFSC front desk and signing in. In-person hiring events are being explored at this time. Contact us for updates and changes as they occur.

Hiring Events: Held bi-annually, the whole 2nd floor of the MFSC building is filled with 40+ employers, interview rooms, and if space allows, employment workshops and resume assistance are provided. ***

In-Dependents: Transitioning from high school to the next phase can be daunting. This bi-annual event is for high school students/graduates and at least one parent. It breaks down all the information one should know to move on successfully.

Volunteer Opportunities: A one-hour information session on how to volunteer within the JBPHH community and/or with MFSC directly. Takes place on every 3rd Thursday of the month at 1:30 PM.

Military Spouse Employment Boot Camp: Take this bi-annual class to experience the “basics” of each employment topic covered under the Family Employment (FERP) umbrella. One class where military spouses can collect foundational information on Interviewing, Resume Writing, Networking, Negotiating and much more!

Employment Hot Topics: A one-hour class that covers topics most requested throughout the different employment classes and appointments. This is an interactive workshop where students practice translating experiences, elevator pitches, quantifying skills and much more!

MILITARY SPOUSE EMPLOYMENT PARTNERSHIP (MSEP)

MSEP is part of DoD’s Spouse Education and Career Opportunities (SECO) initiative through Military OneSource. It seeks to strengthen education and career opportunities of military spouses.
