



Navy Region Hawaii Exceptional Family Member Program Resource Guide

This guide provides a listing of commonly used military and local community resources for Service and Family Members enrolled in the Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP). Please note that all resources are subject to change.

The Navy's Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) serves Navy families with special needs. The EFMP is a mandatory enrollment program for Service members with qualifying family members. Enrollment in the EFMP ensures Service members are assigned only to those geographic areas where the medical (physical, developmental, and/or mental health) and/or educational needs of their family member(s) are available and accessible.

Qualifying special needs include, but is not limited to, family members who require any kind of specialty medical care or doctors and/or any type of educational support services, either of them lasting 6 months or longer. Some examples of qualifying services: early intervention services, Individual Education Program (IEP), referrals to speech/occupational therapy, clinical counseling, required adaptive equipment assistive technology devices and services and/or wheelchair accessibility. Additional criteria can be found in the DoDI1315.19, section 3, Criteria for Identifying Family Members with Special Needs.

The EFMP provides for the identification of the family member's special needs through enrollment forms, assignment coordination, and family support.

The Navy Family Accountability and Assessment System (NFAAS) application maintains the electronic EFMP enrollment (and updated) paperwork. NFAAS provides capabilities for non-clinical case management by an assigned EFMP Case Liaison allowing for documentation of referrals provided, individualized service plans (ISP) and family needs assessments (FNA) developed. NFASS also allows the Service member to track the status of his/her enrollment. A Family Member's User Guide is available under the help tab. The Fleet and Family Support Program is the Information and Referral (I&R) conduit for questions from families regarding available resources on base, those located in the local community as well as within the state and nationally. EFMP Family Support

- EFMP Case Liaisons are located at the Fleet and Family Support Centers (FFSC) and are assigned to Sailors enrolled in the EFMP
- Provide information, referral, system navigation and support to special needs families on various topics such as: Tricare/medical, schools, support groups, housing, special education, respite, and PCS moves etc.
- Link families to available military, local, state and national resources.
- Develop and maintain ISPs and FNAs
- Review Individual Education Program (IEPs) and attend IEP meetings for family support
- Delivers/coordinates EFMP type training for families, supports EFMP related events on/off base and for commands
- Provide training to command EFMP POCs
- Partners with the military treatment facility (MTF) EFMP Coordinators providing information, education/training and marketing about the EFMP to clinic staff

When to Update EFMP Enrollment

1. How do I update the required services for my EFM?

A new EFM package is required for any type of change, to include increase or decrease services required. The process is identical to a new enrollment. The Sponsor will need to complete the **DD Forms 2792** and **2792-1** with the MTF EFM Coordinator. The package will be sent to the Central Screening Committee who will determine eligibility for enrollment. The Sailors detailing record will be updated if eligible for enrollment.

For JBPHH, the Navy MTF EFM Coordinator is Ms. Nida Lalau. She is located at the Navy/SMART clinic. Her phone number is (808) 473-2444, option 9, EXT. 4525.

2. How do I check the status of my enrollment update/disenrollment?

The Sponsor can log into <u>NFAAS</u> to check on the status or they can reach out to their local case liaison.

3. How often am I required to update my EFM status?

An update is required every three years, or sooner, if the medical and/or educational requirements change.

Conditions that warrant temporary enrollment as determined by the Central Screening Committee require updated enrollments to be submitted to NAVPERSCOM (PERS-456) by the EFMP coordinator after 6-12mos of enrollment.

4. Why do I need to update my EFM(s), if I am remaining in the same Geographical location?

EFMP updates are **required every three years** and as care requirements change. When staying in the same geographical location you are required to keep your EFM(s) information current, verify that they are still authorized dependents and ensure the reason for enrollment has not been resolved or changed.

5. My dependents case has disappeared from NFAAS what can I do?

You can do one of the following:

- a. Contact NAVPERSCOM (PERS-456) at 901-874-2496
- b. Submit a trouble ticket to My Navy Career Center at 901-874-6622/askmncc@navy.mil
- c. Reach out to your local case liaison for assistance.

6. Does my EFMP status reflect in my detailing Record?

Yes, your detailer can see when a Sailor is enrolled in EFMP. However, they cannot see the reason for enrollment or associated paperwork.

7. I have multiple dependents enrolled in EFMP, when do I update them?

All EFMP packages should be updated every **three** years, but to make it easier on your family you can update them all at once. Each dependent will still need their own packages if you are routing them together.
