# Do you feel that you are making the most of your stay here in Hawaii?

Well, maybe you are, but have you ever thought of learning how to sail? One day, when you inevitably leave this beautiful island destination, you'll want to tell everyone about all the awesome things you got to do in Hawaii; why not add sailing to the list! Fortunately, MWR offers sailing lessons and boat rentals out of two locations here on Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam: Rainbow Bay Marina and Hickam Harbor. Don't sail away... keep reading to find out more about lessons offered and to hear about the experience our customers had with the JBPHH sailing program!

There are a variety of lessons offered but we got to hear from Melanie Beachy about her experience with the private sailing lessons at Rainbow Bay Marina. Melanie first discovered her desire to learn sailing after going on a sailing date with her husband, Brian Beachy. She later enrolled in two private sailing lessons at Rainbow Bay Marina. Melanie went from zero sailing experience to becoming quite comfortable controlling a sailboat; she commented that her instructor described things in a very practical way so that it was easy for her to learn quickly. "I opted for one-on-one instruction to gain experience with a particular sailboat, the Capri 18. Since my husband and I recently bought a boat, and he'd need assistance sailing, it was important for me to learn on that particular size boat," said Melanie. That's amazing that you can become comfortable after just two lessons! When I asked if she was nervous at all during her experience,



she replied, "Yes, but the calm demeanor of my instructor and his willingness to clarify everything I had questions about put my fears at ease." She elaborated that once her fears were set aside, the sailing experience allowed her to see the island from a different perspective; and that she found watersports to be an amazing way to engage with nature here in Hawaii.

Another option is to take one of the group classes offered at MWR's Outdoor Recreation. The photos featured on this spread shows one of the Instructors, Allen teaching an Adult Small Boat Class (with students Kelly, Rebecca, and Brenda) to sail on the Hopper sailboats on Hickam Harbor. These small sailboats really help students learn the basics on sailing. They rely strictly on both your movement and body weight to keep the boats moving and from capsizing. But don't worry! Capsizing is all part of the fun of learning and Allen is always close by on a motor boat to help. Before heading out on a boat by yourself the instructors will teach you everything you need to know and how to set up the sailboat and sail by yourself. One of the students, Kelly shared that on your first day they will have you on a boat tethered to the motorboat, so you won't sail far into the open water before you're ready.

So, after hearing from our customers and learning about the classes, it seems sailing can be a fulfilling hobby while living here in Hawaii. Are you interested in booking your own lessons or renting a sailboat for the day? Both the Hickam Harbor and Rainbow Bay Marina are open Tuesday-Sunday from 9am-5pm (excluding holidays). 


