Home Schooling: The Department of Education (DoE) recognizes home schooling as a viable and legitimate educational alternative for children. Parents electing to home school their children must inform the DoE of their intent. Notification is made to the local public school by completing DoE OCISS Form 4140, Exceptions to Compulsory Education, or submitting a letter with a statement of intent to home school. School Age Care (SAC) – Two SAC programs operate on JBPHH – one each in Hickam and Catlin Housing areas. Each serves multiple HiDoE schools on and adjacent to JBPHH. Care available before and/or after school, all day on school-out days, breaks & summers. Details available by calling each program.

Child Development Homes (CDH): The CDH program provides high quality childcare through a network of certified home providers living in Joint Base Pearl Harbor Hickam housing areas. Home providers offer child care for children ages six weeks to 12 years. They offer developmentally appropriate activities in a home setting. Hours are flexible to meet parent's needs. ASYMCA: The Armed Services YMCA (ASYMCA) of Hawaii provides a variety of Pre-school Classes (ages 3-5 years), Early Learning Readiness Programs (ages 0-3 years), Play Morning/Operation Little Learners (ages 0-5 years, cost \$3.00 per session), and a Children's Waiting Room Childcare at Tripler (ages 0-12 years). Our school program are part-time 2-3 days a week. They provide all the quality social and educational interactions to prepare your child for Kindergarten. We have several locations on Oahu, at Joint Base Pearl Harbor/Hickam, Wheeler, K-Bay, Aliamanu Military Reservation, and Tripler Medical Center. Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP):

The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) is designed to assist active duty members and their families with special needs. Those with special needs are identified by physical, mental health and or educational limitations. EFMP enrollment is mandatory at the time conditions are identified, and therefore will not hurt chances for advancement. Those enrolled in the program will be considered for assignments that support the needs of the family member that requires specialized services.

Whether you are newly enrolled or new to the community the EFMP Liaison will be able to assist you with information and referral to community services and aide with enrollment process. Please contact your local EFMP Liaison at (808) 474-1999 to make an appointment.

To enroll, Navy families will use Navy Family Accountability and Assessment System (NFAAS), or visit the MTF Coordinator located at Tripler Army Medical Center, (808) 433-9644. Air Force families interested in enrollment should call Hickam Clinic at (808) 448-6782.

NFAAS users initiate enrollment and track progress of their cases. EFMP enrollment is mandatory and required upon identification of a special need. DD Form 2792, Exceptional Family Member Medical and Educational

Summary and DD Form 2792-1, Exceptional Family Member Special Education and Early Intervention Summary are required for enrollment. Successful implementation requires up-to-date information and extensive coordination between personnel, medical, educational and family support communities.



Hawaii Department of Health – Immunization Requirements

Hawaii State Law requires all students to meet certain health examination and immunization requirements before entering public or private school.

- Tuberculosis (TB) clearance must be complete within one year prior to first entrance into a Hawaii school* and performed by the State of Hawaii Dept. of Health or a U.S. licensed medical doctor, osteopathic doctor, advance practice registered nurse or a physician's assistant. Infants who attend school prior to their first birthday must submit TB certificate.
*School is defined as pre, elementary, high, child care, day care, nursery, group, charter or private.
- Your child's physician must complete the physical examination and transcribe the information onto the Form 14 (Student Health Record, Rev. 2009), Immunization and TB info must be included.
- Immunizations required for school attendance include:
 1. DTaP/DTP/TD (Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis)
 2. Polio
 3. MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)
 4. Hepatitis B
 5. HIB (Haemophilus Influenza type B).
 6. Varicella (Chicken Pox)
- Proof of address. (letter from housing, a lease/mortgage, utility bill etc.)
- Individualized Education Plan (IEP) from last school if applicable
- Release statement from previous school that includes: unofficial transcripts and or latest report card
- Any medical consent forms needed
