



Have you heard of NFAAS or AFPAAS?

(Navy/Air Force Accountability and Assessment System)

NFAAS/AFPAAS are websites designed to help Navy/Air Force personnel and their families directly affected by natural and/or man-made disasters

BEFORE A DISASTER:

- Sailors and Airmen: Establish an account and ensure that your contact information is up to date. This should be done on an annual basis and after PCSing to a new location. (Note: Navy members are required to update their contact information 2 x year)
- Explore and download resource information. NFAAS/AFPAAS sites include directories of phone numbers, useful and relevant resource materials, and helpful fact sheets!

DURING / AFTER A DISASTER:

- When an area has been declared a disaster, Navy and Air Force personnel are directed to login, muster, and report the status of themselves and their family members
- If directly affected by the disaster, they will have the option to complete a needs assessment survey indicating the type of assistance they are requesting. Once completed, they will be connected with a case manager to assist in coordinating the needed resources to assist them (Navy personnel will be connected with an MFSC Emergency Case Manager, Air Force personnel will be connected with their command leadership)
- If not directly affected by the disaster, they will be directed to the "My Info" tab to verify and update their contact information



DID YOU KNOW?

Navy: Ship or sub-based deployments typically last 6 or 7 months. The time at sea may be broken up by port calls, where the ship pulls into a town and the sailors are permitted to go ashore and enjoy some time off. **Air Force:** While some Air Force deployments last for 6-12 months, Airmen may also do a series of 2-3 month deployments in quick succession. Differences in deployment tempo are usually based upon job and unit.
