Employment Resource Center

Located at MFSC JBPHH Moanalua Center, this self-service center is offered to service members and their families. It offers employment information, job search resources, local job announcements, and five computers with Internet and printing. Classes and Events

Hiring Events: Held annually, the entire 2nd floor of the MFSC Building is filled with over 40 employers and rooms for immediate interviews. Employers are looking for you in

one centralized location. Bring lots of copies of your resume, dress to impress and go for it!

LinkedIn: More and more each day, employers are looking to social media to gain a better understanding of potential employees. LinkedIn is a centralized space for professional networking. This class leads attendees through LinkedIn and provides guidance on how to best utilize the site, get yourself noticed and network effectively. Info on free premium access is also included.

Career Exploration: Discover what may be the perfect career for you through personality assessments and career study. Focus on your strengths, avoid undesirable career aspects and learn strategies to benefit your career!

Civilian Resume Writing: This class provides students with information on different types of private sector resumes and the basics of writing a resume and cover letter. Attendees will gain the tools to write a resume on their own and learn how to gain further support.

Federal Employment 101: Navigating USAJobs The federal employment process can feel confusing. We will help you navigate the USAJobs website and understand the application process from start to finish. Learn how to build a competitive application and explore hiring preferences and programs for veterans and military spouses. This class is a prerequisite for the Federal Employment 102: Federal Resume Workshop.

Federal Employment 102: Federal Resume Workshop. After you attend the Federal Employment 101 class, we invite you to attend this workshop where the instructor will help each attendee with their own resume on their own laptop in order to target their resume towards a job that interests them. Bring your laptop with a draft resume and a job announcement. The workshop is short but intensive. For further, in-depth federal resume assistance request an appointment via the Centralized Schedulers (808-474-0129/0126) Acing the Interview and Salary Negotiations: Learn what is needed to have a successful interview and then find ways where negotiating will be a breeze! Position yourself as the best candidate, learn different interview techniques, practice interview questions and learn to avoid common pitfalls. Mock interviews can be coordinated as well. Salary negotiation best practices and insightful activities to prepare are included.

Part Time Money Makers (PTMM): PTMM can help you discover creative ways to earn supplemental income and/or save money you didn't know you had! This course will cover legitimate, remote employment opportunities; leveraging your hobby into a money maker, and quick-start income opportunities and money saving apps. We also help you to identify red flags for scams and determine your entrepreneurial potential.

Military Spouse Preference (MSP) Priority Placement Program: Spouses of active duty (AD) military members & full time National Guard/Reserves may be eligible for Military Spouse Preference Priority Placement. To be eligible, spouses must apply for jobs within the commuting area of sponsor's permanent duty station (PDS); provide proof of marriage, PCS orders with spouse's name on it, & other documentation required by the vacancy announcement to which you are applying. Candidates must meet all pre-employment criteria. To utilize MSP build/post a resume to the USAJOBS profile & upload essential documents, including the Military Spouse PPP Self-Certification Checklist which must be dated within 30 days of your application date. For further assistance, make an appointment with an employment counselor.

Military Spouse Employment Partnership (MSEP)

MSEP is part of DoD's Spouse Education and Career Opportunities (SECO) initiative through Military OneSource. It seeks to strengthen education and career opportunities of military spouses. The site provides career exploration, education and training opportunities with options for specific funding programs, and assists spouses in identifying academic, licensing, and credentialing requirements. This program offers employment readiness, selfmarketing skills, and connections to find a rewarding career. The MSEP program links companies with direct access to military spouses seeking career opportunities and vice versa.
